Our program is free and open to eligible 16- through 24-year-olds, and graduates go on to employment, apprenticeships, higher education, or the military.

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We continuously evolve and update the Job Corps training program based on the labor market so that each student's training aligns with local workforce needs. While enrolled, Job Corps students learn in the classroom and in the real world through work-based learning and internships with local employers. Many complete Advanced Training or pre-apprenticeships, and others earn college credit hours through our college partnerships.
